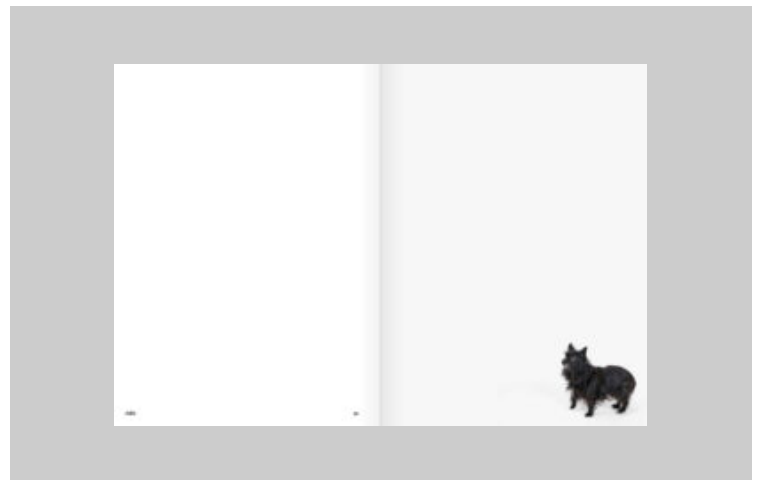
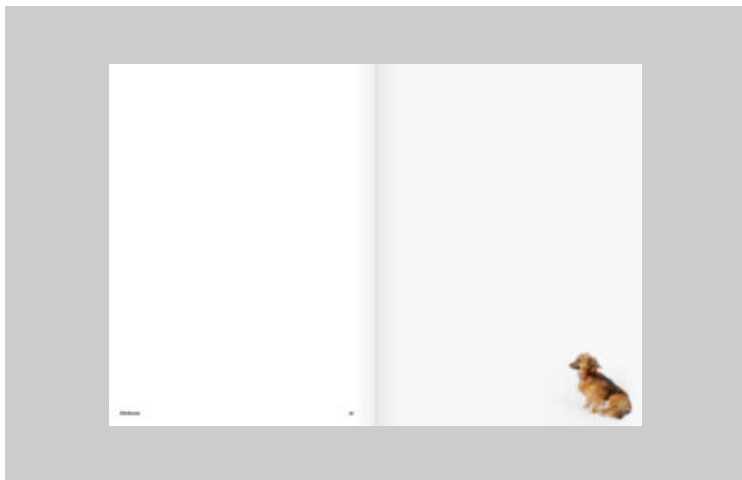
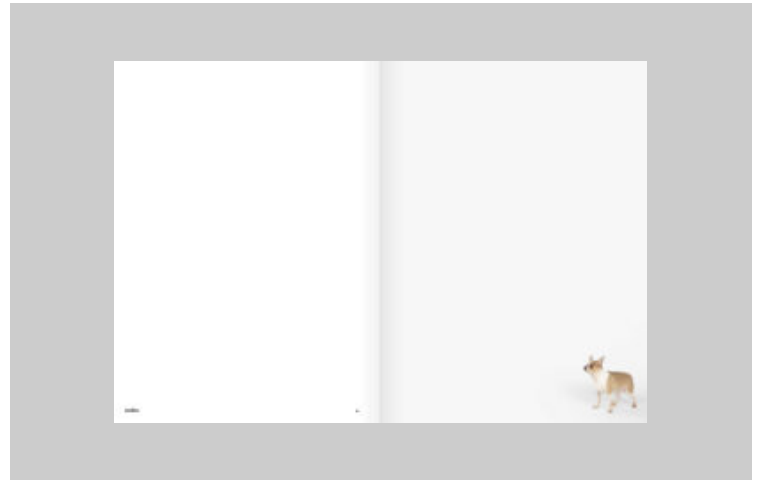


# Chiens de Lanester Olivier Leroi
